### **Tasks**

The Department for Environmental Supervision has the following tasks:

- Execution of state environmental control for assuring compliance with Georgian legislation (including implementation of conditions of license/ permit) by the regulated community in the field of environment.
- Monitoring of legislation compliance by inspection of the regulated society; including creation of a database of subjects of regulation, analysis of the reports on implementation of conditions of license/ permit granted for the production activity.
- Promotion of compliance with environmental legislation by providing information, preliminary warning, carrying out special supportive programs and preventive activities among others.
- Development of strategic directions of state environmental control.
- To prevent, reveal and deter (within its competences) administrative offences in the field of environment protection and to confiscate illegally obtained resources.


